4. BAB Working Group Updates

4.1. Members received updates from the leads of each of the BAB working groups, who also provided slide decks, highlighting emerging priorities:

4.2. Net Zero

Observations from members included:

- Pull between increasing energy requirements of new technologies such as AI and the need to reduce energy consumption
- Final Investment Decision has not yet been announced for the HyNet project
- The move towards Net Zero provides many opportunities and therefore prioritisation will be necessary Role for the local Growth Plan in this

4.3. Community & Employment (Skills)

Observations from members included:

- There is potential to build on the existing employer portal produced by (former LEP)
 ECW
- Importance of not 'reinventing the wheel', but bring things together and publicise to avoid duplication
- Need for a central business resource
- Query to what extent will Artificial Intelligence provide solutions to queries need to take into account to avoid new solutions potentially being superseded quickly
- New Government Business Growth Service intended to provide a central resource through Growth Hubs

4.4. Infrastructure

Observations from members included:

- Artificial Intelligence Growth Zones provide a potential opportunity
- Note that the hydrogen produced by HyNet will not be suitable for vehicles initially

4.5. Sectors and Investment

Observations from members included:

- Inward investment may bypass C&W as there is no obvious central point of contact
- There are some good examples of inward investment strategy in the private sector (e.g. Alderley Park), we should look at best practice and consider replicating
- Caveat to the above that the private sector has differing drivers and priorities
- Desire to understand what has been tried and was/wasn't effective
- Cheshire has a different inward investment landscape than city-region neighbours with restricted supply of labour and commercial premises/land and therefore needs a focussed approach
- Need to ensure that enabling infrastructure (housing, transport, etc) is in place to support investment
- Consider 'post investment' follow up to understand why businesses chose C&W and what their experience has been as investors.
